What do I need to know?

What do I need?

A frisbee, any will do but if you want to take it seriously you can get different types of discs. Putters, midrange and drivers all behave in different ways to make it easier for you.

What are the rules?

Basically the rules are very similar to real golf. Throw your frisbee from the "Tee" to the "Hole" and count the number of throws it takes you to get it in the "hole" (disc catcher). The person who uses the least number of throws wins the game.

Where can I play?

Rosshall Park is right next to Rosshall Hospital, it hosts a great fun 9 hole course which is perfect for beginners.

The ARC course is right beside Ashgil Recreation Centre in Milton (Glasgow). It hosts a fun 6 hole beginners course.

Ruchhill Park hosts a challenging 9 hole course with plenty of variety on offer for all players. There is also the option to hire discs for just £1 from Comet Pieces (just a 10 min walk away).

The <u>Springburn Park</u> course is a massive 18 holes and offers a real challenge to all players. With raised disc catchers and plenty of water hazards (don't forget your fishing nets).
