Loch Katrine & Glasgow's

Water Supply

Loch Katrine is a freshwater loch in the heart of Loch Lomond and the Trossachs National Park.

Do you know where the name Loch Katrine comes from in Gaelic?

Can you find it on a map, and can you find out how long and wide it is?

It has served as the main fresh water supply for the city of Glasgow for over 150 years. When was it opened and who opened it?

How is the water carried from the loch all the way to Glasgow?





- Steeped in history and magnificent scenery this landscape inspired famous writers such as William Wordsworth and Sir Walter Scott
- Sir Walter Scott wrote the world-famous poem 'Lady of the Lake' about Loch Katrine and its surrounding area.
- There is a steamship called the Sir Walter Scott, which regularly sails the length of the loch during the summer months.
- An 'Aqueduct' takes water from the loch using the force of gravity all the way to Glasgow!
- It was built in Victorian times and was regarded as one of the world's greatest engineering feats.
