

Old Man's Beard

A type of lichen commonly found growing on trees, it is pale green in colour with a wispy, hair like appearance. It is formed by a symbiosis of two or more organisms, often fungi and algae.

Lichen plays an important ecological role, providing microhabitats, shelter and food for small invertebrates. These in turn are prey for larger insects and birds.

It prefers clean, unpolluted air so is often used as a bioindicator to show where pollution levels are low.

- Colour for dyeing textiles
- Herbal medicines
- Cosmetics, preservatives & deodorants
- Antibacterial & Antifungal
- Tinder for fire making flammable
