

The Rowan Tree

(Sorbus Aucuparia)

Beautiful, mystical and visually striking (*in full bloom*) the Rowan can be a sensory overload. A native tree which is as happy growing in gardens and streets as it is in the high mountains.





- Can grow up to 15m tall
- Can live for up to 200 years
- Is a hermaphrodite, meaning each flower has both male and female reproductive parts.
- Creamy white flowers in May and scarlet red berries in Autumn.
- Folklore:
- It's old 'Celtic' name is 'fid na ndruad' meaning wizards tree.
- It was once widely planted by houses to protect against witches.
- Cutting down a Rowan was considered a taboo in Scotland.
