

## **The Whangie**

(Queen's View)

The Whangie is a geological rock formation, carving a deep vertical slice in Auchineden hill which you can walk through.

With a slight detour, this can form part of a very scenic route up the hill, also known as the Queens View.

Folklore suggests that the slice was created when the Devil, who was having a meeting with his witches, got so excited by the stunning views over Stockie Muir to Loch Lomond that he swished his tail creating the slice!







- The geological term for the slice in the rock is 'Glacial Plucking'
- The name is thought to derive from the Scots word for slice 'Whang'
- Queen's View forms part of the Northern Kilpatrick hills.
- 2.5-3 Hour round trip.
- The ground is very boggy, so wear your wellies.
- Fantastic views over Stockie Muir, Burncrooks reservoir and the Highland Boundary Fault islands of Loch Lomond.
- Forms part of the 'Clyde Plateau Lavas' which are over 340 million years old.
