- Regarded as Scotland's own Robin Hood!
 Rob Roy was born in Glen Gyle and was buried at Balquidder. He became a Scottish legend by raiding the lands of the Duke of Montrose for his cattle.
- The Reverend Robert Kirk wrote the book called The Secret Commonwealth of Elves Fauns and Fairies.
- A world famous novelist, Sir Walter Scott brought the Trossachs to life with poems telling it's medieval past. Perhaps one of his most famous, called the Lady of the Lake was based around the shores of Loch Katrine.
- The surrounding area boasts many of Scotland's famous historical landmarks. These include Scotland's only lake, the Lake of Menteith.
- On a small island on the lake is Inchmaholme priory, famously used to hide a young Mary Queen of Scots.
